Today's Message: Redeemed To Make an Impact

Theme: Redeemed to make impact

We have seen what redemption means and how it may be used in the Old Testament. Today we will look at some ways redemption is used in the New Testament. Note, Christ redeemed the Church (us) for a reason, what is the reason? What is expected of the redeemed of the Lord?

In the N.T. redemption is used to represent Christ's mission on earth – He is our redemption - Gal. 3:13; 4:5

- Eph. 1:7 - In Him we have redemption through His blood, the forgiveness of our trespasses, according to the riches of His grace.
- The Cross Work of Christ has redeemed us from all sin (God has passed over our sins) - Romans 3:25
- Christ become a curse in our place – Gal. 3:13
- We are rescued from darkness – Col. 1:13
- We have become a Kingdom people, priests to God, and we enjoy the benefits of sonship- Revelation 1:5-6; Gal. 4:5
- We are not afraid of the End Time and the signs that come with it - Luke 21:28

Our response to redemption:

See 1 Corinthians 7:22-24; Ephesians 4:30

How? – one specific way to respond:

Titus 2:11-14 – We must be eager to do what is right
